We are grateful to the 1,029 patients who recently helped us with our survey about our buildings.

Responses identified that availability of car parking space was a key concern, and that our older facilities fell far behind North Carlisle in their suitability for future General Practice. Key services beyond GP appointments and pharmacy were identified (in reducing frequency) Physiotherapy, Mental Health Services, Podiatry and Advice services to Carers.

In our attempt to address these needs we continue to work with a developer in our efforts to gain approval for funding from the NHS for a new purpose built building, so that we can reduce our number of buildings to three, yet still continue to offer services from the same three places: North Carlisle, South Carlisle and City Centre.

The new building would be as much about enabling new, more efficient, more responsive ways delivering care, working closely with other organisations, in this age when we continue to have difficulty in recruiting new GP partners.

Every month, Carlisle
Healthcare survey's the
patients after they have
had an appointment.
In August, 630 were
surveyed and 200 replied.
82% of them said they
would recommend the
practice to a friend. That is
above last month, and
above the national average
of 75%.

Carlisle Healthcare's upgraded website launches in November. Flu Clinics

In line with Public Health England guidelines, the Practice is able to offer a new vaccine to those over the age of 65 years. We now know that older people have a weaker response to the existing flu vaccine. The new vaccine works by boosting your immune response and therefore this vaccine offers greater protection against the flu virus than the conventional one.

This vaccine may not be available in most pharmacies, and we therefore advise that you check with the pharmacy, or arrange to have your flu vaccination at one of our clinics.

There is no need to make an appointment as these are drop in clinics.

For those patients under 65 who have long term conditions i.e. Diabetes, COPD, Asthma etc.:

Saturday 29th September from 8.30am to 3pm held at both the North Carlisle Surgery and also the Eastern Way Surgery.

Saturday 10th November from 8.30am to 3pm held at the St Paul's Surgery

For patients over the age of 65:

Saturday 20th October from 8.30am to 3pm held at both the North Carlisle Surgery and also the Eastern Way Surgery.

Saturday 10th November from 8.30am to 3pm held at the St Paul's Surgery.
